SYNOPSIS & SETTING

The play is based on a novel by author Harper Lee, published in 1960. The plot and characters are loosely based on Lee's observations of her family, her neighbors and an event that occurred near her hometown of Monroeville, Alabama. The play takes place during the Great Depression in the fictional "tired old town" of Maycomb, Alabama. It focuses on Jean Louise Finch (Scout), her older brother Jem, and their widowed father Atticus Finch. Judge Taylor appoints Atticus to defend Tom Robinson, a black man, who has been accused of raping Mayella Ewell. Many people disapprove of Atticus doing this, and Jem and Scott are taunted for Atticus' actions.

And here at the Actors Guild, we're looking ahead to our next season. Even though it doesn't begin until September we are busy now making sure we will be ready for it when the time comes.

Our process begins with the reading of plays by the Playreading Committee who have been at work on this very important task since very early last summer. After many, many meetings and many, many hours spent individually reading the dozens of scripts being considered, they then present a slate which is voted on by our members at our November membership meeting.

The members look forward to this all-important meeting where they can hear all about the shows being considered and then make a well-informed decision. I thought as patrons you might be interested to know not only what is coming, but what shows were on that ballot, since many times the "losers" from one year reappear in the next year's vote and are then chosen for that season.

For our first show of the year, the choices were *Ring of Fire: The Music of Johnny Cash* and *The Glass Menagerie*. The winning show was *Ring of Fire*. The next slot gave us the choice of *A Christmas Story*, *The Musical* and *The Drowsy Chaperone*, with *A Christmas Story* being selected. The next slot, our Guild Builders slot, contained the choices of *Disney's Aladdin JR.* and *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, with our members selecting *Aladdin JR.* The next slot gave us the option of two mysteries: Ken Ludwig's *The Game's Afoot* and *Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery*. The winning mystery was *The Game's Afoot*.

The next slot gave us a choice of two large musicals, *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels* and *The Producers*, with *The Producers* winning that slot. That was followed by two recent classic options: *Driving Miss Daisy* and *On Golden Pond*, with our members choosing *On Golden Pond*. Then our final slot of the year gave us the choice between *Hair* and *La Cage Aux Folles*, with *La Cage* being the winner for the slot.

As with any election, some people are happy with the outcome, others are not. Perhaps as you looked at the list of choices, you saw a show that you wish had been the winner, but maybe it will be back on the ballot next year and will win.

So, as we "spring forward", we hope you like our choices and will join us for another season of great theatre in Parkersburg.

Who's Who in the Cast & Crew

SARAH BOGGS “SUNNIE” (Jean Louise Finch) first appeared on the Guild's stage at age twelve in the 1991 production of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*. She has since participated in seventeen other Guild productions (including as Mayella Ewell in the 1997 production of *To Kill a Mockingbird*). Sunnie is a bartender at Ruby Tuesday, mother to the world's most adorable 6-year-old boy, and in 2016 completed a cross-country walk of over 3,000 miles, from Delaware to California, with her father Gary to raise money for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and the Parkersburg Humane Society.

SIMON CANNIZZARO (Newspaper Boy) is very excited to be a part of his first AGP production. He is a first grade, home schooled student and loves performing and playing Zelda with his brothers. He has previously been on-stage in *Seussical JR.* (Lincoln Theatre) and *The Nutcracker* (tour) as well as other performances with MOV Ballet and ADTA where he takes ballet, jazz and tap instruction.

SABRINA DYE (Maudie Atkinson) is excited to be back on the Guild stage for this wonderful production with an incredible cast. She has been involved with local community theater for over 30 years. Her main passion is lighting op and design. On occasion she gets to play on stage, most recently in MOVPS production of *Dracula* and *I Hate Hamlet*. More often Bre works many aspects of tech. GABRIELLE LAZZARINO (Mayella Ewell) is so excited to be a part of The Actors Guild Production of *To Kill A Mockingbird*. This is Gabrielle's first

production with the Guild, and she would like to thank the wonderful cast and crew for being so kind. 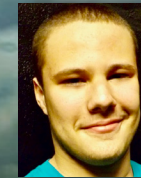
