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

more about our organization and ways that you too can be a part of this great group of dedicated individuals who do so many things for the love of theatre.



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Director's Note

O DIRECT A SHOW OR NOT, THAT IS THE QUESTION. Do I want to invest the time and effort into a project like directing a musical at the Actors Guild? One of the first steps in the decision is – do I like the music and does the story speak to me? My first impression of the title was that it was a children's show, so I didn't even take the opportunity to see it when I was in New York and it was on Broadway. But, then a year or so later, I heard the music and absolutely loved it!

There are so many fun moments in this show that it might not be obvious that it is also filled with life lessons. And, not just lessons for children, but lessons for people of all ages. So, as you watch the show, I would like you to listen and think about some of my favorite lines.

In Act II, scene 9, Shrek sings to Fiona: "Beautiful ain't always pretty." What a great reminder to not always judge others by their appearance, as sometimes the ugliest or oddest people can be those who have the most beautiful character within.

In Act II, scene 8, Shrek says to Donkey, "If I treated you so badly, then why did you come back?" and Donkey responds: "Because that's what friends do! They forgive each other!" This is an important step for Shrek as he learns to tear down the walls he has put up between himself and a society who rejected him, opening himself to the possibility of the support, comfort and companionship found with true friends.

And, finally in Act II, scene 7, Gingy advises Pinocchio to accept his unique qualities and say: "Hey, world, I'm different and here I am, splinters and all!" This is a sometimes quite difficult lesson to learn, that it's okay to let the world see who you really are and that you are comfortable in your own skin. And, in the words of the lovable band of misfits, those wonderful Fairy Tale Creatures: "What makes us special makes us strong!" — a great reminder to embrace our unique qualities.

As we finish the show with the phrase "This is our story!" we hope you will see that this is your story, too, that you'll see yourselves in our characters, that you'll see past the green makeup and fur and see our wonderful show, full of heart, full of strength and full of lessons for our own lives.

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
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Opening in June
